





Welcome to the zine





CHAPTER 1

Hacking the future of innovation policies

CCIs do not fit into the usual innovation mold. We're like a swarm. We're *many*, we're *small* and *fragmented*. We're not afraid to—and in fact prefer—to fly against the grain. We require openness and trust. We're often navigating between contradictory values. But that often leaves us unsupported and undervalued.

Instead of fitting into the mold, can we expand it to fit around us? In this zine you will find concepts and scenarios that intend to do just so. They provide rough-edged outlines of what could be. And it's up to us (and the policies that we create) to fill those outlines with actions that would bring them to life.

This zine comes from within that swarm. A collection made by and for those of us working, experimenting, and dreaming across the cultural and creative industries.




So why a zine about innovation policy?


Zines as a format stem from underground communities seeking independent and more open-ended ways to publish, build vocabularies of resistance, and mobilise together. It's certainly not the typical format for talking about policy. The **focus on visual language and unrestricted narratives** might feel **UNUSUAL** or even **UNCOMFORTABLE** in comparison to a typical policy paper...and that's the point!



We want to challenge you (and ourselves) to step away from the usual policy contexts that might open new ways of thinking, talking, imagining and building the future.



CHAPTER 2

Imagining public innovation infrastructures



Innovation doesn't happen in a vacuum. It needs physical places, people, and shared practices that connect ideas to action. Yet, one of the biggest obstacles for the CCIs is the absence of structural support.

Unlike tech startups that benefit from incubators, accelerators, and investors who speak their language, creatives often navigate a fragmented landscape, moving between projects, policies, and possibilities with little scaffolding in between.

If we want CCI innovations to benefit the public, it only makes sense to embed their innovation process in public infrastructures. So let's consider how existing public organisations could play this role of innovation intermediaries and support systems for CCIs.

What if innovation was nurtured in a neighbourhood house, a regional museum, or an ongoing arts festival?

What if our infrastructures were as creative, open, and participatory as the people who use them?


Each "What if..." scenario begins as a **BLUEPRINT** and becomes a story. The following blueprints are an invitation to imagine, adapt, and prototype – to see how these ideas might take shape in your own context. Think of them as starting points for reimagining how public spaces can support creative innovation with empathy, community, and storytelling at the core.

The Neighbourhood House

What if our public innovation infrastructure is a neighbourhood house that facilitates encounters between CCIs, citizens and local businesses, inviting them to address shared local challenges while practising empathy, shared values and storytelling as key open innovation skills?


Sustainable innovation funding

Does current funding for innovation match the characteristics and ambitions of Cultural and Creative Industries?

We know what **does not work**

- ✗ Short-term project cycles
- ✗ Simplification of impact through market-driven metrics
- ✗ Centring of grand ambitions and large scale
- ✗ Fast pace
- ✗ Exclusion of artistic practices from innovation processes
- ✗ Lack of flexibility
- ✗ Focus on predefined outputs and policy goals

But what does **a meaningful alternative** look like?



Let's all get comfortable with innovation results that are unexpected and difficult to measure. And let's inspire others to break away from the cage of limitations!

and maintaining those relationships, with flexibility to adapt outcomes to changes of the wind



What if convincing impact made room for the unruly, the grassroots, the not-yet-polished?

We cannot afford to be an absent voice while innovation strategies get shaped without us. And we do not deserve to be seen as risky innovators - we are worthy investments that bring complex and enduring value.

Let's challenge the perception that we exist on the fringe of innovation and instead become the sharp edge that shapes its core. Let's create narratives that help us and others see our value and strengths reflected across innovation ecosystems.

Creativity is not a garnish or a temporary intervention. So stop thinking of us as a nice "add-on" in your collaborations!


When fully integrated, our skills can help us move from complex problems to systemic changes.



Rewriting innovation funding vocabulary

Funding language builds barriers. Vague terminology, grandiose expectations and policy jargon excludes those trying to find their way into the innovation landscape. A good innovation idea does not guarantee funding unless it is translated into the language of buzzwords and KPIs.

Can we build a new funding vocabulary to invite open-endedness, inclusivity, curiosity and playfulness?




Redefining the end goal

The WHY of the innovation funding 🌎

Why must we always focus on inventing something new? Do we not risk doing innovation for innovation's sake? Can we be sure that we are solving real world problems rather than checking boxes on policy agendas?

Let's diversify our innovation targets. It's not only about scaling up and bringing more things to the market. Let's focus on derisking innovations, demystifying technologies, scaling down and slowing down, and reducing inequalities.

Let's put the health of ecosystems and the wellbeing of our communities at the heart of innovation success.


Let's rewild the innovation community through a broad range of innovation successes.
